



**Fifteen minutes with your Creator can change your entire day.
Use this resource to guide your time with God this week.**

DAY 1: 2 KINGS 23, Israel's Final Years

- Underline the descriptions of the last three kings of Judah.
- What does it tell you that the Israelites returned to evil even after spiritual revival?
- Do you ever feel like you go back and forth between right and wrong?
- Ask God to give you strength to consistently follow Him.

DAY 2: HABAKKUK 1, The Prophet's Complaint

- What is Habakkuk's complaint to God? Is he right to feel this way?
- Have you been frustrated by not understanding what's going on in life?
- Talk to God about your frustration. You are free to express your emotions.

DAY 3: HABAKKUK 2, God's Answer

- God explains His plan to punish Babylon. In verses 4, 14, and 20, God shows how people will respond. What does God want people to do?
- God's promise to Habakkuk will take 70 years to fulfill. What promise of God's do you wish would happen now?
- Ask God to give you faith to wait on Him to do what He promises.

DAY 4: HABAKKUK 3, The Prophet's Prayer

- In his prayer, Habakkuk remembers all that God has done for Israel. Can you remember ways that God provided for them in the past?
- How has God worked in your life to prove that He is trustworthy?
- Thank God for what He has done in your life to help you trust Him.

DAY 5: REVELATION 21, God's Promise for You

- God promises heaven to all who believe in Jesus. Underline all the aspects of heaven that give you hope.
- How does the assurance of heaven help you get through the tough times in life?
- Listen to the song, "Better is One Day" by Matt Redman.

Explain what you are learning about God's faithfulness through Habakkuk to your children in terms they can understand. Draw pictures with them to depict times when they have experienced sadness, frustration, or disappointment. Talk with them about what it would mean to trust God even during the tough times in life.
